Comments

Patient seems quite distressed and down. He lives in a residence and is struggling with self-isolation. He did not want to talk about his family and whether he receives any phone calls from them. A caregiver makes his bed and does his laundry, and he gets occasional help for bathing. He often cooks his own meals as he doesn't like the food at the residence. He mentioned several times that he is struggling financially as his rent has increased and **he is worried about being able to afford groceries and his medication** with just his pension. He worries a lot about his neighbours in the residence and is very frustrated over the government and community response to helping the elderly during this pandemic, says no one is helping them, etc. He **said several worrisome things** during our conversation, including statements such as: "I don't care anymore, I'm just going to go outside and go for a walk, I don't care if I get the virus", "I never thought I would live to 84, and never had the desire to live to this age", etc. He also mentioned that he sleeps a lot and ended our conversation so that he could go back to bed (around 11AM). I think he would highly benefit from a phone call with a nurse and he was open to the idea of one calling him to check in and see how he's doing.

Patient Comments

When asked how patient was doing with all this, her first response: i'm depressed. When asked to further elaborate on her feelings, she explained that she's all alone with no family near and she's very anxious (7.5/10). She receives food only from the Shaare Hasidic (her sources of food). Her last delivery was yesterday and she was told she was given enough food for three days. I asked her if the Shaare will be giving her more food in three days and she said they could not tell her yet. She is very nervous that **she will not have access to more food**. Also, patient was able to tell me the month and season. **She knew it was some time in the 2000s,** but said she does not keep track of the exact year. Otherwise, she answered all other questions appropriately.

Daughter is concerned about her 89 year old father. Right now he is in stable condition but is socially isolated. She is concerned about his drinking habits and worries that he might dependent. He is diabetic and is on synthroid and puffers- she wants to know where to take him because his endocrinologist is closed and he is not being followed by anyone. She also expressed interest in contacting a social worker.
